CPSA imposes practice condition for Dr. Yolanda Alcaraz-Limcangco

Edmonton, AB – Calgary physician Dr. Yolanda Alcaraz-Limcangco has had a practice permit condition imposed by the Registrar of the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA), limiting her practice to mental health concerns. She had previously been practicing 'full spectrum' family medicine; however, the College feels that it is in the public's best interest to restrict her practice.

Dr. Alcarez-Limcangco recently applied to the Court of Queen's Bench to have the imposition of the practice permit restriction removed, and was unsuccessful in that effort.
