CPSA Statement on Bill 207: Conscientious Rights Protection Act – Notice of Proposed Amendment dated November 18, 2019

The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) fundamentally believes our Conscientious Objection Standard of Practice (SOP) sufficiently protects access to care and meets the needs of all Albertans, while respecting the rights of physicians' conscientious beliefs.

CPSA has provided suggestions to MLA Mr. Williams on the proposed amendments to Bill 207 and believe the new wording is in greater alignment with our Standard of Practice. Based on the new wording, Bill 207 would not change how CPSA functions as a regulator.
