

## MD Snapshot-Prescribing Overview

**MD Snapshot-Prescribing** is your customized prescribing profile, generated using data for medications monitored by the <u>Tracked Prescription Program (TPP) Alberta</u> and received from Netcare/Pharmaceutical Information Network (PIN). The Snapshot is a tool for self-reflection and education, with the dual purpose of increasing your prescribing awareness and supporting you in optimizing care for your patients.

The benchmarks used in MD Snapshot-Prescribing are informed by guidelines, evidence of risk and best-practice recommendations. **MD Snapshot-Prescribing is not a comment or judgement on your prescribing practices**. We recognize there are wide variations in practices and patient complexities (even within peer groupings).

MD Snapshot-Prescribing now covers four categories of prescribing:

- Antibiotics
- Benzodiazepine/Z-drugs
- Opioids
- Opioid New Starts (formerly opioid-naïve)

## Each category includes:

- Summaries (comparator group information is available)
- Details on patients considered higher-risk (e.g., multiple prescribers)
- Breakdowns by ingredients prescribed (excluding Opioid New Starts)
- Prescribing trends over several quarters (excluding Opioid New Starts)
