

11 PHM: Chaperone Requirements

POLICY # & TITLE	11.2 Chaperone Requirements
PURPOSE	Describe the requirements and/or recommendations for regulated members to have a chaperone present during patient encounters.
SCOPE	Regulated members with a practice permit condition requiring a chaperone.
NOTES	Regulated member means any person who is registered or is required to be registered as a member of the CPSA. The CPSA has developed a training course for chaperones to help them understand the roles and responsibilities of a chaperone, which is available to any regulated member's office staff. The CPSA may require that a regulated member send a staff member to attend this course. The CPSA does not consider an accompanying family member or other third party a trained chaperone.

POLICY STATEMENT

The CPSA may require regulated members to have a chaperone present during patient encounters which may include the following measures:

- 1) Request that one of their office staff be present as a chaperone during patient encounters
- 2) Ensure that their office staff is trained on the role and responsibilities of the chaperone, including taking an approved chaperone course, if required
- 3) Ensure compliance with CPSA chaperone requirements.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Registrar's duties and responsibility under Part 3 of the HPA have been delegated to the Assistant Registrar(s) and/or Competence Committee responsible for continuing competence, including physician health monitoring.
