# Health Research

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The **Standards of Practice** of the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta ("CPSA") are the **minimum** standards of professional behavior and ethical conduct expected of all regulated members registered in Alberta. Standards of Practice are enforceable under the *Health Professions Act* and will be referenced in the management of complaints and in discipline hearings. CPSA also provides **Advice to the Profession** to support the implementation of the Standards of Practice.

**Note:** a glossary of terms can be found at the end of this document. Glossary terms are indicated in teal with a " $^{\circ}$ " throughout this document.

### **PREAMBLE**

This standard applies to any regulated member involved in health research<sup>G</sup>, as identified through a current and recognized screening tool: as of Mar. 2025, <u>ARECCI (A pRoject Ethics</u> Community Consensus Initiative) is the recommended tool.

Regulated members who perform health research are encouraged to complete the Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans (TCPS 2) CORE-2022 Course on Research Ethics and are expected to be familiar with relevant published statements concerning the conduct of research, including the Canadian Medical Association's (CMA) Code of Ethics and Professionalism and any other provincial and national requirements.<sup>1</sup>

## **STANDARD**

- 1. A regulated member who intends to conduct health research **must:** 
  - comply with the <u>Health Information Act</u>, including submitting a proposal to a research ethics board in the Province of Alberta for review;
    - i. such boards include:

### Terms used in the Standards of Practice:

- "Regulated member" means any person who is registered or who is required to be registered
  as a member of this College. The College regulates physicians, surgeons and osteopaths.
- "Must" refers to a mandatory requirement.
- "May" means that the physician may exercise reasonable discretion.

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- 1. Health Research Ethics Board of Alberta (HREBA)
- 2. Conjoint Health Research Ethics Board (CHREB), University of Calgary

- follow all applicable Standards of Practice (e.g., the Conflicts of Interest standard of practice);
- have approval from a research ethics board before commencing health research, where appropriate;2 and
- d. comply with the requirements of the research ethics board as they relate to initial and ongoing review of the research study.
- 2. A regulated member recruiting or enlisting participants for health research must
  - charge the participant any fees; or a.
  - ask the participant to contribute to the research costs.3

# **GLOSSARY**

Health research: any research that aims to improve human health by leading to improved disease diagnoses, more effective treatment options or a strengthened health care system.4
